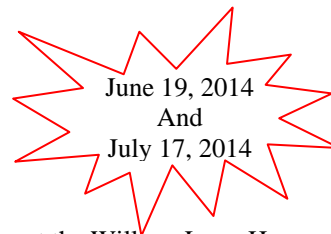

WORLD JAMBOREE HISTORY

The first world Jamboree was held in 1920 in Olympia Halls, Kensington, London. About 8,000 Scouts and Guides were attendance. Since then the Jamboree has been held roughly every four years (with a 10 year hiatus because of World War II). World Jamborees have been held in countries in every corner of the world. France, Australia, Greece, Canada and Thailand are just a few of them. The 1979 World Jamboree that was to held in Iran is the only Jamboree to be cancelled.

Next year will be the second time that Japan will host the Jamboree. There will be almost 5 times as many participants than the first Jamboree.

In 2019, the Jamboree will be held at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia. It is being billed as the North American Jamboree because BSA, Scouts de Mexico and Scouts Canada are joining forces to run the event.

After 2015 it will be eight years before US Scouts will have the opportunity to participate in a Jamboree in a foreign country.
